All U.S. Figure Skating member clubs are charged with the responsibility of creating a safe environment that allows their members participate, develop and achieve success in the sport of figure skating. Most clubs are run by a board of dedicated volunteers and offer test sessions, competitions, exhibitions, ice shows and a variety of other programming options for their skaters and the surrounding community.

Types of Membership

Full Membership (Minor): \$165

- For skaters aged 17 and under, includes one free non-skating parent membership
- Voting Rights

Full Membership (Adult): \$125

- For skaters 18 and older
- Voting Rights

Full Membership (Additional/Subsequent): \$65

- For subsequent skaters or family members (must accompany full membership)
- Voting Rights

Associate: \$75

- For skaters who want to have
 SSFSC privileges and belong to another home club
- Non-Voting

Full Membership (Introductory): \$75

- For first-time SSFSC and USFS skaters (only eligible for one membership year, this restriction includes prior memberships with other USFS clubs)
- Non-Voting

Full Membership (Collegiate 4-year): \$150

- For full-time undergrad or graduate students (valid for one continuous period of 4 years)
- Voting Rights

Full Membership (Coaches): \$75

- For professional coaches
- Voting Rights

Testing

Background Information

- > Testing is important for all skaters to demonstrate progression through the sport
- Needed in order to qualify for competitions
- Tests available in several disciplines, Skating Skills (formerly Moves in the Field), Ice Dance Partnered/Solo, Pairs and Singles
- Testing levels use the medal color designations (Bronze/Silver/Gold)
- When passed the final Gold level test, considered a 'Gold Medalist'

Virtual Testing

- New method of USFS testing vs traditional in-person testing
- Test session generally every month
- \$40 members/\$55 non-members
- Video tape your video NO EARLIER than 14 days before deadline
- Video requirements on USFS
- Result usually come out in 7 days or less after deadline

Competitions

Non-Qualifying

- Compete USA (Basic Skills) events promote a fun, introductory competition experience for beginner skaters. Provide a positive opportunity to compete at the grassroots level
- Skaters of all ages can participate in nonqualifying competitions to earn awards and showcase skill mastery.
- Nonqualifying competitions are divided into two tracks: one is more recreational (Excel) and the other is more competitive in nature (Well-Balanced).
- Excel Series, skaters compete at certain nonqualifying competitions to earn an invitation to the Excel National Festival.

Qualifying

- The pipeline for singles, pairs and ice dance teams to advance to the U.S. Championships, international competitions, World Championships and Olympic Winter Games.
- The top skaters advance in the juvenile to senior levels and compete for various titles based on age and test level.
- Synchronized skating has its own qualifying competition system, which leads to the U.S. Synchronized Championships, international competitions (junior/senior) and the World Junior and World Synchronized Skating Championships.

Collegiate Skating / Scholarships & Funding

Collegiate Skating

- Whether you have been skating since you were young, learned to skate in college or are returning to the ice after a long absence from the sport, U.S. Figure Skating's collegiate programs are a great opportunity to make friends with shared interests, assimilate to a new life at school, obtain leadership skills and stay in shape, regardless of level or experience.

What is Synchro

- Synchronized skating is a team sport in which 5-20 skaters perform a program to music together. This form of skating is often characterized by teamwork, speed, intricate formations and challenging step sequences and the objective is for the team to perform and move as one unit.
